Join us as we celebrate the beginning of the school year with fun, food, and drink. Bring your friends, bond with fellow members, and meet your new officers and chairs!

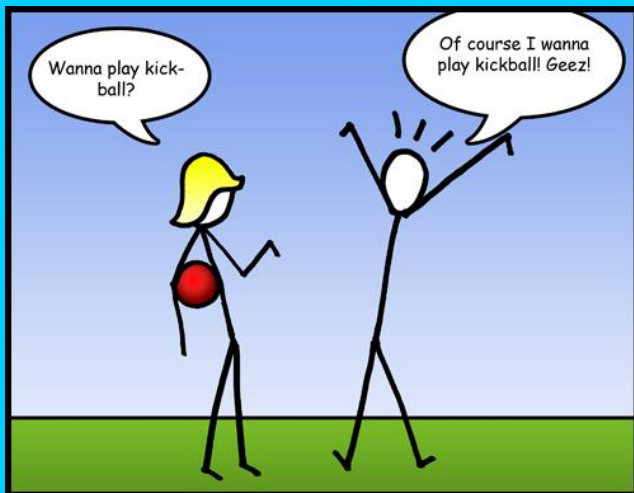
Wednesday September 8th:

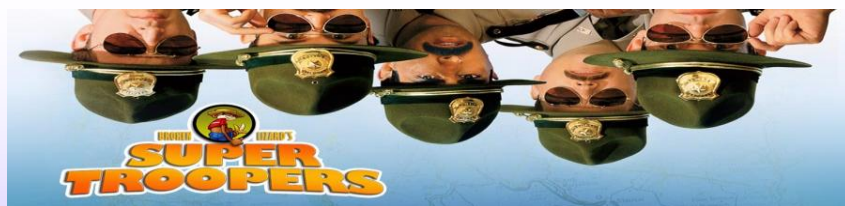

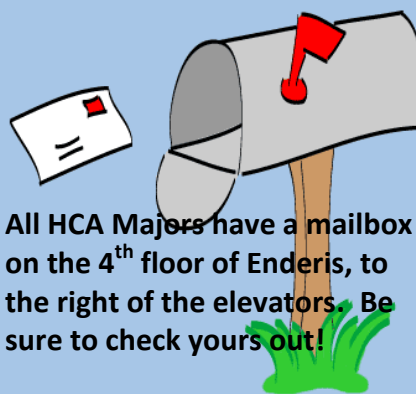
